

Senior All-Night-Party Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

How do I sign up?

Seniors need to register and pay in advance in order to attend the all-night party. Register [HERE](#). After submitting the Google Form, you will be directed to pay on GiveButter. **Please adjust “tip to GiveButter” down to \$0.**

Can I volunteer? **Sign Up Genius coming soon!**

Yes! EVEN if you are not an "All Nighter" and you don't want to work at the party, there will be plenty of opportunities to contribute. The SignUp Genius is posted on the website and can be found [HERE](#).

How many seniors are signed up?

There are 300 kids in the Class of 2023. Our goal is 100% attendance. If prior years are representative, we hope for 300, but will most likely have around 240 in attendance. All graduates are eligible to go, including exchange students! The venue is accessible for all mobility needs and there will be activities for all interests and fitness levels.

What activities are planned?

We have a variety of activities planned for the evening to meet the needs of all types. We have contracted with a professional entertainment company to provide many of the activities. You will also be able to use many of the activity areas at the facility. We will also have a casino, game area, and many more surprises.

What do I need to bring to the All Night Party? YOU!

If you need to bring essential items, you may bring 1 clear, gallon size ZipLock bag - these will be provided and marked with your name and bus number. You will pick them up from volunteers as you enter Cornerstone on the way to the graduation rehearsal or the breakfast that precedes it. No other bags or backpacks are allowed.

Essentials you may want to bring in the ZipLock bag provided:

- Phone/charger
- Personal care items, if needed (contact solution, toothbrush, deodorant, feminine hygiene items)
- Car keys

Will my bag be checked?

Yes. Junior parents will search your ZipLock bags as you load the bus. They check everything airport TSA style. They will be looking for drugs (approved medication **must be labeled**), alcohol, weapons, vapor cigarettes, etc. If you can't have it on FHN school grounds, you can't have it at the Senior All Night Party.

Aside from the items listed above, DO NOT bring the following to the party.

- No items of value (jewelry, expensive clothes/shoes)
- No CASH - You do not need any money at the party
- No laptops, no iPads, or any electronics, etc.
- No blankets/pillows
- No YEARBOOKS - we wouldn't want you to lose it.
- NO LARGE BAGS.

What is included and do I need spending money?

Your ticket covers everything - transportation, food, snacks and activities. No spending money is needed.

How much time do I have after the ceremony ends?

We will provide up to 30 minutes after the ceremony ends for you to say goodbye to family and to change into comfortable clothes. Then, please move quickly to the buses so as not to delay our departure and to get to the venue on time. Be sure to take family pictures before graduation. NOTHING MAY BE LEFT AT THE GRADUATION VENUE.

Do I need to register?

Yes. We need both payment and registration. Tickets will be on sale until March 1, 2023.

If I cannot afford the full ticket price, can I still come? Can I request assistance?

YES! Please speak with Rebecca in the front office or email the board at fhnseniorclass@gmail.com for confidential financial assistance. We want as many students to attend as possible. This is your celebration.

Can I drive to the party?

No. ALL STUDENTS MUST RIDE THE BUS. Parent volunteers will need to drive to the venue. The location will be emailed to volunteers. Graduates CANNOT ride with their parents to the party venue. FHPS transportation department requires a passenger manifest for each bus, plus it helps us account for each graduate in attendance. We do not want to leave anyone behind!

Where is pick-up? and When?

We will return students to Calvin University by 4:30 am. It could be a little later than this depending on how long it takes to board and make sure everyone is accounted for. Parents can choose to pick up their graduate at Calvin or plan to have them drive home. This decision is to be made by each parent/graduate individually, understanding the risks involved since the graduate may have been awake all night.

Can I leave my car at Calvin?

Yes. Buses will bring graduates back to their cars. If parents choose to pick up their graduate, they should also make arrangements to remove their car.

Will there be supervision?

The venue will have staff and security. We will also have parent volunteers assigned to monitor exits and circulate throughout the facility. The ziplock bag with your “essentials” will be at a “bag check” area monitored by parent volunteers. You will be able to check your bag out and return it whenever you need to.

What if a student misbehaves or brings alcohol, drugs or weapons to the venue?

They will be asked to leave immediately. We will call parents to come pick them up.

Who hosts this event?

Fellow Senior parents have planned and organized this party. We also need parents to help chaperone the event. A SignUpGenius will be posted in the future.

How is the party funded?

Our goal is to make the event available to 100% of the Seniors through support of parents, local companies and fundraising events. Each donation and sponsorship goes to defer the cost of the venue, transport, food and snacks and entertainment. We run several fundraisers (Vitale’s Dine-In and Pizza Sale, Husky Fest, Paw Invasions, Graduation Yard Signs, Community Movie Night, and Evereve Shop In and Kennedy’s SWIRL Flower Sale). Sponsorship opportunities are also available.
