English Language Arts

Recognize and name all upper and lower case letters of the alphabet

Demonstrate an understanding of spoken words, syllables, and sounds

With prompting and support, identify characters, settings, and major events in a story

Demonstrate basic knowledge of one-to-one letter-sound correspondences

Read emergent-reader texts with purpose and understanding

Write a letter or letters for most consonant and vowel sounds

Birthdays
